RABBIT REFINEMENTS



Rabbits need environmental refinements in order to express normal behaviour, exercise, and cope with behavioural and physiological challenges.

Types of refinements include:

Social (Direct or visual contact with other rabbits)



Structural (Promoting movement or exercise)



Physical (Addition of objects to chew or manipulate)



Food-based

(supplements or methods of feed delivery)

WHAT IS REQUIRED?

According to the Code of Practice, cages/pens **must have** at least 1 type of refinement. Two or more refinements is **recommended** to ensure normal, beneficial behaviours.

These refinements must be monitored to ensure the safety of the rabbits. They must also be replaced or sanitized when soiled.

- Hard wood gnawing blocks/sticks
- 📀 Hay, straw, or litter

- Multi-level cages/pens
- Tubes/tunnels
